Council Member Chukwuocha WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-363 of the Code of the City of Wilmington ("City"), the City may apply for and receive grant funds to be used for a wide variety of City activities, subject to the approval of City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City has been approved by the Department of Education for the State of Delaware to receive grant funds from the Federal government for the operation and cost of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (the "Food Program"), which is set to run from October 3, 2016 through September 30, 2017, and which may be extended for one similar period upon the agreement of the parties; and

WHEREAS, the amount of the grant funds for the FY2017 Food Program is estimated by the Department of Parks and Recreation to be approximately \$485,273.00 based upon the increased number of meals projected to be served in comparison with the FY2016 Food Program (see Exhibit "A"); and

WHEREAS, although the City is not required to provide matching funds for receipt of these grant funds, the City is initially required to pay the Food Program vendor with City funds and is then reimbursed by the Federal government through the State of Delaware for the payments. There will be no net financial impact on the City, provided the City complies with all Federal and State requirements attached to the Food Program; and

WHEREAS, the City has prepared the necessary specifications to solicit bids from prospective vendors to submit bids for a contract to provide meals to eligible participants in the Food Program, which contract may be extended for one additional similar period; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation has recommended that City Council approve the City's use of the grant funds for the Food Program in accordance with the terms of the grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE

CITY OF WILMINGTON that the use of the herein described Federal grant funds received from the State of Delaware for the Food Program be accepted and approved, and the Mayor or his designee, and the City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute any and all appropriate grant documents or other undertakings pursuant thereto as may be necessary. This grant and the resulting contract to provide meals for the Food Program may be extended for one additional similar period upon the agreement of the parties.

Dear Mr. Lane,

Please accept this letter as acknowledgement that the City of Wilmington is beginning to prepare for the startup of the Fiscal Year 2017 At Risk Program through the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP). We understand that over the next few months you will be working to procure meals for your sites, train your monitors, and finalize your feeding sites.

In fiscal year 2016, the At Risk program has generated \$410,851.33 in Federal reimbursement based on meals served to the children at your feeding sites. Please note that this does not yes include reimbursement for the month of September 2016 as it is not yet complete. This is a total reimbursement from October 2015 through May 2016. Reimbursement is calculated at meals times rates. The reimbursement rates are issued each year by USDA. If your program operates at the same capacity as last year, you can anticipate receiving approximately the same reimbursement.

The attached screenshot is from DENARS. This is the budget that you entered for fiscal year 2016. You can see that the budget entered was \$542,036.00 and DOE approved a budget of \$485,273.00. In the end, the amount generated from CACFP At Risk Program so far is \$410,851.33.

We will be issuing a formal approval letter to all sponsors once they complete reapplication this fall. Once approved, we will begin to reimburse for the meals served to the children in your program.
