## RES17-009

Wilmington, Delaware February 16, 2017

WHEREAS, an Act to amend Title 14 of the Delaware General Code relating to school attendance has been presented to the State General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, House Bill No. 17, sponsored by State Representatives Earl Jaques, Helene Keeley, and Harvey Kenton, seeks to increase the compulsory education age from 16 years to 17 years; and

WHEREAS, the Bill is in alignment with local- and State-sponsored initiatives focused on improving the educational outcomes for City of Wilmington ("City") students; and

WHEREAS, increasing the compulsory education age from 16 to 17 years would aid the City and the school districts serving our students with decreasing dropout rates and increasing graduation rates; and

WHEREAS, the measure, which aims to reduce truancy and dropout rates, would have a lofty impact within our communities and the City as we strive to create a globally competitive educated workforce; and

WHEREAS, increasing the compulsory education age from 16 to 17 years also decreases the likelihood that students would unsuccessfully end their educational career due to being "lost in the system," because mandating that the student attend school until the age of 17 years enables the student and his or her family to receive the school- and districtbased support available; and

WHEREAS, the proposed changes support the efforts of the Wilmington Education Improvement Commission (WEIC), the Wilmington Education Strategies Think Tank (WESTT), and the Wilmington City Council Education, Youth and Families
