People keep coming, playing themselves, in a sense below what they deserve and it reminds of all these years in the banking industry, folks who go to get a loan and they get a loan for just enough not to be able to success. So, I make a motion that we add another two thousand five hundred.

Council Member Turner: Second.

Council Member Freel: On the question.

President Shabazz: Say it again.

Council Member Freel: On the question.

President Shabazz: On the question.

Council Member Freel: Um, Madam President, I have no problem if a-if the applicant wants to come back to Council for additional funds but um - I don't want to get in the habit of amended all these Resolutions on the floor. So, I'm going to hold it – **hold this Resolution**.

President Shabazz: So moved. Next.

Mrs. Seijo (City Clerk): Yes, thanks.

On behalf of President Shabazz, Council Member Freel presented Resolution No. 17-082 (Agenda #4442) as follows:

WHEREAS, Section 2-369 of the City Code requires grants awarded by the Mayor, City Council or the City Treasurer in the amount of \$5,000 or more to be approved by resolution of City Council; and

WHEREAS, City Council wishes to award a grant to Neighborhood House, Inc., in the amount of \$15,000; and

WHEREAS, this grant funding will be used to develop new programming and expand existing programs for engaging youth in positive activities to increase their chances for staying in school, making healthier life choices, and choosing alternatives to crime, violence, drugs, and teen pregnancy – thereby providing important support to Wilmingtonians; and

WHEREAS, this cause is closely aligned with the priorities of the City Council Strategic Planning Process, specifically in its focus on youth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON, that City Council hereby approves the issuance of a grant from City Council to Neighborhood House, Inc., in the amount of \$15,000.

Upon a motion of Council Member Freel, seconded by Council Members Oliver and Dixon, the Resolution was before the Council for its consideration and Council Member Freel spoke on the purpose of the Resolution.

Council Members Harlee, Oliver and Dixon asked to be added as cosponsor.

As noted, upon a motion of Council Member Freel, seconded by Council Members Oliver and Dixon, the above Resolution was received, adopted as read and directed to be recorded and filed by the following Yea and Nay Roll Call Vote: Yeas, Council Members Chukwuocha, Congo, Oliver, Harlee, Turner, McCoy, Williams, Freel,

Adams, Dixon, Guy, and Council President Shabazz. Total, twelve. Total, one. Absent, Council Member Walsh. Total, one.

President Shabazz: Declare it adopted.

Council Member Freel: That's all I have, thank you.

President Shabazz: Council Member Adams.

Council Member Adams: No ma'am, no legislation this evening.

President Shabazz: Council Member Dixon.

Council Member Dixon: Nothing tonight Madam President, thank you.

President Shabazz: Councilman Guy.

Council Member Guy: Nothing tonight Madam President, thank you.

President Shabazz: Now we go – move to go into Petitions and Communications.

Council Members Williams and Freel asked to be excused.

PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Council Members announced civic association/community and committee meetings as well as community events/activities throughout their districts. Council Members also spoke about the following matters: Governor Carney and his Innovation Department were thanked for their efforts in addressing some of the needs of inner city schools; closure of vehicle road access on Saturdays in November from 7:00 a.m. to noon on Park Drive between Market Street Bridge and Van Buren Street Bridge; the Police Department and neighbors on 21st and Washington Street were encouraged to provide some supervision between 6:30 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. and around 2:30 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. as the children who catch the bus on the corner are being very disruptive and to the neighbors; constituents were encouraged to participate in the civic association and neighborhood planning meetings; the Police Department was also thanked for their increased visibility and engagement; constituents were encouraged to participate in a survey as it relates to the development that's going to take place in Wilmington (survey: www.surveymonkey.com/r/wilmington2028); several groups were thanked for their festivities; Christina School District Superintendent listening sessions; Gabriel Pabon was thanked for taking the initiative to start back up the Bayard Square Neighborhood Association; issues with dumping in the district and constituents were encouraged to report dumping; State Representative JJ Johnson was thanked for the invite to a re-entry simulation; Market Place is now open for health insurance and closing date is on December 15th; response from Attorney General's Office of the Resolution related to

bump stocks and similar devices; meeting at P.S. duPont to give an update on demolishing Burnette School; the City is working on getting a simulation program in the City of Wilmington; the six recommendations from the CDC to address the unintentional policies that adversely affect the benefit of our children; reminder of upcoming Committee of the Whole (Nov. 20th) to address the Council's Strategic Planning Process as well as the recommendations from the Council's Organization Report; Council's new website www.wilmingtoncitycouncil.com; and including but not limited to, everyone was encouraged to participate in the City of Wilmington and New Castle County Fixing Drive for the NOR Enterprise 35th Annual Turkey Giveaway, which will be collected until Nov. 21st. In addition, fixings can be dropped off at the Public Works Turner Building.
