	WHEREAS, addiction is a chronic disease plaguing many members of our
#XXXX	community and March 6 th is commemorated as Black Balloon Day, a national event aimed at
Sponsors:	raising awareness of overdose deaths and reducing the stigma of drug-related deaths; and
Council	WHEREAS, drug overdose is the leading cause of accidental death in the United
Member Congo	States, and overdose deaths involving prescription opioids were five times higher in 2016
Council President	than in 1999. Overdose deaths in Delaware climbed from 172 in 2012 to 228 in 2015, and
Shabazz	again rising to 308 deaths in 2016; and
Co-Sponsors:	WHEREAS, research produced by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and
Council Members	Prevention notes a 105% increase – the 2^{n0} highest in the United States – in Emergency
Dixon Williams	Department visits for suspected opioid overdoses in Delaware, reaffirming the need for better
	coordination and collaboration amongst public health and public safety agencies; and
	WHEREAS, having recognized the widespread and devastating nature of the opioid
	crisis, Senate Bill 48 and 147 in the Delaware General Assembly provide legal immunity to
	public safety personnel in connection with administering naloxone – a medication designed
	to rapidly reverse opioid overdose, expanding the privilege beyond peace officers. To date,
	40 states and the District of Columbia have enacted some form of a Naloxone Good
	Samaritan Law, and this medication is now available without an individual prescription at
	participating Delaware pharmacies; and

WHEREAS, this day encourages stimulatory discussion to educate communities on overdose prevention and provide basic information on the range of support services that exist throughout the State of Delaware.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE

CITY OF WILMINGTON, that Council seeks to call attention to the pain felt by family and friends who have dealt with overdose, and to commemorate the lives and legacies of loved ones lost as a result of a drug overdose. Council further endeavors to do its part to disseminate information about resources available to those suffering from drug addiction, and to advocate for increased resources to address this vital need.
