LEGISLATIVE BUSINESS

President Shabazz: I'm going to make some um, order of the presentation this evening. I'd like to begin with, ah, item #4620 Councilwoman Harlee.

Council Member Harlee: Ok, Madam President, I have a Resolution to present.

Council Member Harlee presented <u>Resolution No. 19-001</u> (Agenda #4620) as follows:

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2018, the City Council, as required by Section 2-101 of the City Charter, formally declared that: the First Councilmanic District position is vacant as of November 6, 2018 at 8:00 p.m. due to former Council Member Nnamdi O. Chukwuocha's resignation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Wilmington City Charter, Chapter 2, <u>Wilm.</u> C. (Charter) § 2-101, when such vacancy occurs between General Elections, it is the duty of City Council to fill said vacancy with a member of the same political party residing in the same council district in which such vacancy occurs for the un-expired term of the of the resigning Council Member; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Wilm</u>. <u>C</u>. (Charter) § 2-103, the City Council is empowered to be the "sole judge of the qualifications . . . of its members" and pursuant to <u>Wilm</u>. <u>C</u>. (Code) § 2-34, the Committee of the Whole has recommended Linda M. Gray to fill the vacancy in the 1st Council District seat.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON, that the City Council appoints Linda M. Gray, a duly registered member of the Democratic Party residing in the First Councilmanic District of the City of Wilmington, to fill the vacancy created by former Council Member Nnamdi O. Chukwuocha, for the remainder of former Council Member Chukwuocha's term.

Upon a motion of Council Member Harlee, seconded by Council Member Walsh, the Resolution was before the Council for its consideration. Council Member Harlee made some comments and spoke of the purpose of the Resolution.

President Shabazz: Clerk will call the roll.

The Resolution was received, adopted as read and directed to be recorded and filed by the following Yea and Nay Roll Call Vote: Yeas, Council Members Oliver, Harlee, McCoy, Williams, Freel, Adams and Walsh, and Council President Shabazz. Total, eight. Nays, Council Members Congo, Turner, Dixon and Guy. Total, four.

President Shabazz: Declare it adopted. I accept a motion to suspend the rules Councilman Freel.

Council Member Freel: Yeah, Madam President, I'd like to make a motion to suspend the rules in order to swear in our newest member Linda Gray.

Council Member Oliver: Second.

SUSPENSION OF THE RULES

Upon a motion of Council Member Freel, seconded by Council Member Oliver, Council suspended the rules for the purpose of swearing in newly appointed Linda M. Gray to the 1st Councilmanic District. Motion prevailed.

*Note: Once sworn-in, President Shabazz requested that Council Member Gray be placed on the Roll and took her seat (noted in the minutes herein under the heading Roll Call).

REGULAR ORDER OF BUSINESS

Upon a motion of Council Members Williams and Turner, seconded by Council Member Dixon, Council returned to regular order of business. Motion prevailed.

President Shabazz: Councilwoman Harlee.

Council Member Harlee: I have an Ordinance to present and call for the first and second reading.

Council Member Harlee presented and called for the first and second reading Ordinance No. 19-005 (Agenda #4621) entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE REMOVAL OF A PORTION OF BALL PLACE FROM THE OFFICIAL CITY MAP

The above Ordinance was given two separate readings by title only and upon a motion of Council Member Harlee, seconded by Council Members Freel, Williams and Oliver, and noted by President Shabazz, the Ordinance was received, recorded and referred to the Public Works & Transportation Committee. Motion prevailed.

President Shabazz: Councilwoman Walsh you are excused, and I'll go back to the original order of the agenda. Councilman Congo, any legislation tonight?

Council Member Congo: Nothing tonight Madam President, thank you.

Council President and Council Members spoke on the following matters: members of Council welcomed Councilwoman Gray to Council; first time in Wilmington history was duly noted in adding another woman on Wilmington City Council with Linda M. Gray (currently seven women); community meetings and community events were announced; a moment of silence was done for former Council Member Richard J. Bartkowski Sr.; committee meeting date was announced; African American month; civil rights; school closings, local funding and the need to get children educated; National League of Cities Discount Prescription Cards (more than 14,000 distributed to date to residents); Delegation of Future Leaders Chatham County Youth Commission; Wilmington Youth Leadership Commission; Mayor's Budget Address (March 28) and including, but not limited to, WITN 22 Team were congratulated on receiving 1st Place 2019 Delaware Press Association Communication's Contest Award.
