Council Member Harlee WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-363 of the City Code, the Council deemed it necessary and proper to specify the requirements for review and approval of City-sponsored grant applications and proposals, including authorization for expedited grant applications when necessary prior to Council's approval by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department") submitted an American Lung Association Tobacco Prevention and Physical Activity Nutrition and Obesity ("PANO") 2020 grant application to the American Lung Association of Delaware and was awarded \$8,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the PANO Program is funded through the Delaware Division of Public Health's Tobacco Prevention Community Contract; and

WHEREAS, the PANO Program was established to enable Delaware communities to develop their own tailor-made smoking education, prevention or cessation programs, incorporating physical activity, nutrition and obesity initiatives, and is estimated to educate more than 10,000 Delawareans annually about the dangers of tobacco use; and

WHEREAS, the Department intends to use the funds to support the Department's Tobacco Prevention and Anti-Vaping Program, which is administered in conjunction with the Department's Winter Basketball Program; and

WHEREAS, the City is not required to provide matching funds; and

WHEREAS, the Council deems it necessary and appropriate to authorize the grant application and the acceptance of the grant award for the aforesaid purpose.

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department") has entered into a partnership agreement with the non-profit organizations FitLot, Inc. WHEREAS, the City is not required to provide matching funds; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it necessary and appropriate to authorize the use of the grant funds for the aforesaid purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON that the Department's acceptance of \$4,010.00 in grant funds from FitLot, Inc. and the American Association of Retired Persons to create an outdoor fitness park at Holloway/Compton Park and to promote it via social media is hereby authorized.

WHEREAS, the total cost of the Project will be \$500,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the City is required to provide an eighty percent (80%) match of the total Project cost, which amounts to \$400,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the City will fund this match requirement through bonds that the City has already sold; and

WHEREAS, the Council deems it necessary and appropriate to authorize the grant application for the aforesaid purpose.

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department") submitted an Outdoor Recreation, Parks & Trails ("ORPT") Grant Program 2020 application to the State of Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control ("DNREC") in the amount of \$100,000.00 to support improvements to Johnston Park; and

WHEREAS, the ORPT Program, formerly known as the Delaware Land & Water Conservation Trust Fund, is a matching grant program assisting with public park land acquisition and outdoor recreation facility development in Delaware, and has provided over \$28 million in matching grant assistance to eligible local, county, and state governments throughout Delaware since 1986; and

WHEREAS, the Department intends to use the grant funds to redevelop Johnston Park's existing configuration to better utilize the available area for neighborhood-oriented activities, including new compliant play and fitness equipment, renovated athletic courts, a new picnic pavilion surrounded by naturally landscaped open space, new park benches, and expanded pathways, which will encourage exercise and outdoor exploration (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the Project is \$300,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the City is required to provide a sixty-seven percent (67%) match of the total Project cost, which amounts to \$200,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the City will fund this match requirement through bonds that the City has already sold; and

WHEREAS, the Council deems it necessary and appropriate to authorize the grant application for the aforesaid purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON that the Department of Park and Recreation's grant application to the State of Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control in the amount of \$100,000 is hereby authorized.

SYNOPSIS: This Resolution authorizes the Department of Parks and Recreation's grant application to the State of Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control for funds allocated pursuant to the 2020 Outdoor Recreation, Parks and Trails Grant Program in the amount of \$100,000.00. The funds will be used for improvements to Johnston Park. A sixty-seven percent (67%) match of the total project cost is required.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: There is no negative fiscal impact to the City. Although the grant requires a sixty-seven percent (67%) match of the total project cost, which amounts to \$200,000.00, such funds will be provided by the Department through bonds the City has already sold.

Council Member Harlee WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2-363 of the City Code, the Council deemed it necessary and proper to specify the requirements for review and approval of City-sponsored grant applications and proposals, including authorization for expedited grant applications when necessary prior to Council's approval by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice/Office of Justice Programs/Office of Justice and Delinquency Prevention (collectively, the "DOJ") solicited applications for funding for the Fiscal Year 2020 Delinquency Prevention Program (the "Program"), which furthers the DOJ's mission to reduce crime and promote public safety by providing funding to states, localities, and tribes to implement programs to address juvenile delinquency and improve the juvenile justice system; and

WHEREAS, the State of Delaware Criminal Justice Council submitted a grant application to the DOJ requesting \$1,000,000.00 from the Program in order to provide funding to the City of Wilmington's Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department") for its Wilmington Youth Leadership Incubator Program for the next five (5) years commencing in Fiscal Year 2020 (the "Leadership Incubator Program"); and

WHEREAS, the Department will be responsible for the planning, analysis, implementation, and assessment process for the Leadership Incubator Program; and

WHEREAS, the Department desires to use the grant funds to reduce juvenile delinquency, particularly juvenile violence in Wilmington by increasing the safety, well-being, and healthy development of youth and families in the City, preventing violence and

promoting victimization healing, reducing youth violence, particularly gang violence and victimization, and increasing youth entrepreneurial and vocational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the Department specifically intends to utilize the grant monies to fund the implementation of the conflict resolution LifeSkills Program, monthly leadership training for fifty-five (55) students, the traditional vocational and educational job placement program Pathways, a youth leadership initiative, and a prevention conference in partnership with the University of Delaware; and

WHEREAS, the City is not required to provide matching funds; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it necessary and appropriate to authorize the acceptance of grant funds for the aforesaid purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON that the Department of Park and Recreation's acceptance of grant funds in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 from the United States Department of Justice/Office of Justice Programs/Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention for the Wilmington Youth Leadership Incubator Program for the next five (5) years commencing in Fiscal Year 2020 is hereby authorized.
