Council Member Harlee presented and called for the third and final reading Ordinance No. 19-053 (Agenda #4745) entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE THE ONE-YEAR EXTENSION OPTION OF THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WILMINGTON AND REVOLUTION FOODS, INC. FOR THE CACFP AT RISK CHILD AND ADULT CARE FOOD PROGRAM

**FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:** There is no negative fiscal impact on the City as the program uses only Federal funds, which have been previously budgeted.

Upon a motion of Council Member Harlee, seconded by Council Members McCoy and Freel, the Ordinance was before the Council for its consideration. Motion prevailed. Council Member Harlee spoke on the purpose of the Ordinance. Council Member Walsh raised a question and President Shabazz responded.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE AN EXTENSION OF CONTRACT 20011PW BETWEEN THE CITY OF WILMINGTON AND BRANDYWINE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC. FOR SEWER MAINTENANCE

**FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:** The fiscal impact of this Ordinance is two (2) one-year contract extensions for the periods of July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 and July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022, at an estimated price of One Million, Two Hundred Eighty-Five Thousand, Eight Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$1,285,880.00) plus a two percent (2%) increase for each extension period.

The above-referenced Ordinance was given two separate readings by title only and upon a motion of Council Member Harlee, seconded by Council Member Freel, the Ordinance was received, recorded and referred to the Public Works & Transportation Committee. Motion prevailed.

Council Member Harlee: I have – my last, um, piece of legislation is item #4757 to present and call for the first and second reading.

Council Member Harlee presented and called for the first and second reading Ordinance No. 20-002 (Agenda #4757) entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE AN EXTENSION OF CONTRACT 20012WD BETWEEN THE CITY OF WILMINGTON AND BRANDYWINE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC. FOR WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: The fiscal impact of this Ordinance is four (4) one-year extension options, at an estimated price of Two Thousand, Nine Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars (\$2,977.00) per day not to exceed Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00), plus an increase of up to two percent (2%) for each extension period.

The above-referenced Ordinance was given two separate readings by title only and upon a motion of Council Member Harlee, seconded by Council Members Freel and Walsh, the Ordinance was received, recorded and referred to the Public Works & Transportation Committee. Motion prevailed.

Council Member Harlee: That's all I have for tonight.

President Shabazz: Thank you. Council Member Turner, any legislation this evening?

Council Member Turner: No legislation tonight Madam President.

President Shabazz: Council Member McCoy, legislation?

Council Member McCoy: Nothing tonight Madam President.

President Shabazz: Council Member Johnson.

Council Member Johnson: Yes, Madam President, I have a Resolution to present.

On behalf of Council Member Walsh, Council Member Johnson presented Resolution 19-075 (Agenda #4742) as follows:

WHEREAS, City Council enacted City Code Section 2-232 establishing procedures for the Chief of the Wilmington Police Department to call for the commencement of an academy class if the manpower of the Police Department falls below ninety-five (95) percent of the number of police officers set forth in the position allocation list attached to the annual operating budget ordinance for the applicable fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, on May 21, 2019, the Council approved the annual operating budget ordinance for fiscal year 2020 (the "Budget Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the Chief of the Police Department has represented that it is anticipated, based upon normal attrition, that the manpower of the Police Department will fall below ninety-five percent of the number of police officers set forth in the position allocation list attached to Budget Ordinance by the end of 2019; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to City Code Section 2-232(b), the Chief of the Police Department has drafted a resolution calling for the commencement of an academy class for the Police Department once manpower falls below the requisite threshold and presented it to Council for its review.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON that the Council hereby recognizes that the Chief of the Police Department has represented that it is anticipated that the manpower of the Police Department will fall below ninety-five percent of the number of police officers set forth in the position allocation list attached to the Budget Ordinance by the end of 2019 and has drafted a resolution calling for the commencement of academy class for the Police Department once manpower falls below the requisite threshold.

Upon a motion of Council Member Johnson, seconded by Council Members Freel and Walsh, the Resolution was before the Council for its consideration. Motion prevailed. Council Member Johnson spoke on the purpose of the Resolution and made comments. Council Member Turner made comments. Council Member Congo made comments. Council Member Walsh made comments. Council Member Oliver made comments. Council Member Gray made comments. Council Member Guy made comments. Council Member Oliver made additional comments. Council Member Johnson made additional comments.

President Shabazz: Are there any comments from the public?

Council Member Guy: She has her hand up and I do too.

President Shabazz: He's the presenter ...

Council Member Turner: Point, point of clarity. Point of clarity.

Council Member Guy: We each get to speak twice.

President Shabazz: I said before ...

Council Member Turner: Point of clarity.

President Shabazz: ... excuse me. Public comment.

Council Member Turner: Point of clarity.

Council Member Guy: Point of order. I call for a vote to override that because it said – will you please read the rule? We each get to speak twice. She had her hand up the whole time he ...

Council Member Turner: Point of clarity.

President Shabazz: And I scanned the floor and there was no one's hands up but Mr. Johnson's so...

Council Member Guy: Her hand was up and mine went up.

President Shabazz: ...well, after ...

Council Member Turner: Point, point of clarity.

President Shabazz: ... I'm speaking please sir. I'm trying to get point – clarity.

Council Member Guy: You're supposed to check. Has everybody once spoken twice (inaudible) ....

President Shabazz: I scanned the floor, I hesitated, no one's hand was up and...

Council Member Guy: I already told you I wanted to speak a second time.

President Shabazz: Then you should have been paying attention to say that you wanted to speak.

Council Member Guy: You just trying to change ...

President Shabazz: As I said public comment please.

Council Member Turner: Point, point of clarity.

Council Member Guy: Call for a roll call vote to override that. That's not...

President Shabazz: Public comment.

Council Member Guy: Call for a roll call vote on, on the point of order. Call for a roll call vote on the point of order.

Council Member Gray: I already seconded it.

Council Member Guy: You seconded it?

Council Member Gray: It's up to her.

Council Member Guy: Yup, seconded. So, take the vote whether we each get our second turn. On the last legislation ...

President Shabazz: So, what am I, so ...

Council Member Turner: That's why I'm asking for a point of clarity.

President Shabazz: I know – I know what it says ...

Council Member Turner: The legislation states -

President Shabazz: ...the legislation, I know what it says. It states also that everyone has an opportunity to speak twice. I scanned the floor, no one's hand is up. So, so, I called for – I hesitated, and I called for the sponsor ...

Council Member Oliver: Why are we still talking? You already ...

President Shabazz: ... to (inaudible) forward ...

Council Member Turner: Parliamentarian ...

President Shabazz: ...then I called for the public comment and there's another set of two after that. So, let me finish what I'm doing as President. Public comment and then we come back, to, um, um the Councilmembers can have their next round of debate.

Council Member Guy: Point of order.

Council Member Gray: Thank you.

Council Member Guy: She seconded the motion.

President Shabazz: I didn't hear a motion. I say it's a point of order.

Council Member Guy: I made a motion.

President Shabazz: Public comment.

Council Member Guy: You're just doing, you're just being illegal because you think you can.

President Shabazz: I am doing because I'm the presiding officer. You're just, you're just out of order.

Council Member Guy: No, that's not what the presiding officer is supposed to do. The presiding officer is supposed to be fair ...

President Shabazz: Oh jezz, I don't know why ...

Council Member Guy: ...we're supposed to each get a second chance on the first round. That's later.

Public Comment Speaker:

Council Member Harlee made comments.

Council Member Gray: Yes, I'd like to make a friendly amendment to this Resolution that we get quarterly reports from the Police Department on their progress and acquired diverse candidates for the class. It's a motion.

President Shabazz: Where?

Council Member Gray: Pardon me?

President Shabazz: Where in the legislation do you – are you saying to add this?

Council Member Gray: Oh, I didn't think of that so. Maybe at the end of ah, 95% of the number of police officers set forth in the position allocation list attached to Budget Ordinance by the end of 2019; and, um and give quarterly reports to Council on progress of diversity candidates. Is that ...

Council Member Oliver: What page?

Council Member Gray: Someone has to second it.

Council Member Turner/Council Member Johnson: Second.

Council Member Oliver: (inaudible) what page.

Council Member Turner: It's only one page.

Council Member Gray: Right.

President Shabazz: It's been moved and seconded that the - - Council Member Gray, can you make clear exactly where you want to insert and what exactly what you want inserted.

Council Member Gray: Ok, I was going to put it – does it make a difference? I was going to...

President Shabazz: It does because you amended a legislative piece of document and so we need to know exactly what the wording and where you want it to go in so we can approve it.

Council Member Gray: I guess after the one, two, three, fourth paragraph, which it says, um, Department has drafted a resolution calling for the commencement of an academy class for the Police Department once manpower falls below the ...

President Shabazz: Can you speak into the microphone please?

Council Member Gray: ... I'm sorry.

President Shabazz: And can you say it exactly? You said you guess. Can you give me exactly the wording?

Council Member Gray: Ok, one, two, three, fourth paragraph, at the end of the fourth paragraph – the last of the paragraph is, Police Department once manpower falls below the requisite threshold and presented it to Council for its review. So, there after that review, it should say, um, "Chief of Police should give Council, City Council Members a quarterly overview of the efforts of acquiring diverse candidates".

President Shabazz: So, can you repeat your, can you repeat your request?

Council Member Gray: That was the end of it. Repeat it you're saying? That Police Chief Tracy provide City Council Members with a quarterly report on the results of efforts to acquire diverse police cadets. I don't have it written down, so you have to read it back to see.

President Shabazz: So, an amendment was made as so noted to the Resolution.

Council Member Gray: Yes.

President Shabazz: Not hearing a second.

Council Member Gray: No, it was seconded.

Council Member Dixon/Council Member Johnson: Second.

President Shabazz: It was seconded?

Council Member Gray: Uh, hmm.

President Shabazz: Well, I didn't hear a second after you said exactly what you wanted that's what I'm saying. That's why I'm asking. I'm trying to do it

proper that you ask for an amendment and you said exactly where you want the amendment and what the amendment is so it's clear.

Council Member Gray: Ok, thank you Madam President.

President Shabazz: Did you get a second?

Council Member Dixon: Yeah, we seconded it.

President Shabazz: You got a second?

Mrs. Seijo (City Clerk): Yes, Johnson.

President Shabazz: It's been moved and seconded that the Resolution be amended as stated. All those in favor signify by saying "Aye". Any opposed? Amendment carried. We now talk – discussing the amended Resolution.

President Shabazz made comments. Council Member Walsh made additional comments. Council Member Guy made additional comments. Council Member Freel made comments. Council Member Johnson made comments.

President Shabazz: Call for the vote please.

The above-referenced Resolution, As Amended, was received, adopted as read and directed to be recorded and filed by the following Yea and Nay Roll Call Vote: Yeas, Council Members Gray, Congo, Oliver, Harlee, Turner, McCoy, Johnson, Freel, Adams, Dixon and Walsh, and Council President Shabazz. Total, twelve. Nays, none. Present, Council Member Guy. Total, one.

President Shabazz: Declare it adopted.
