**WHEREAS**, City Council desires for the City to participate in the Consolidated Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the City fiscal year 2022 corresponds with the federal fiscal year 2021; and

WHEREAS, City Council's Community Development and Urban Planning Committee has completed its review of the proposed City fiscal year 2022/federal fiscal year 2021 annual action plan budget (the "Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Action Plan Budget"), pursuant to a determination that such review should be completed prior to, and, in effect, be separate from the enactment of the City fiscal year 2022 annual operating budget; and

WHEREAS, the Community Development and Urban Planning Committee and the Mayor's Office have reached a consensus with respect to specific categories of spending and the amount of funds to be allocated to each such category, as set forth in the Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Action Plan Budget, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "A"; and

WHEREAS, the Community Development and Urban Planning Committee and the Mayor's Office have agreed further that any substantial changes as defined in the Consolidated Plan regulations in the aforesaid categories and funding amounts will be reviewed in full by the Mayor's Office with the Community Development and Urban Planning Committee before implementation; and

**WHEREAS**, the referenced HUD regulations require that funding applications for the above-referenced funding sources must meet the public action requirements of the Consolidated Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON that Mayor Michael S. Purzycki, or his designee, is hereby authorized to submit the Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Action Plan Budget to HUD, which Plan allocates \$2,251,737 for the CDBG Program, \$579,619 for the HOME Program, \$189,070 for the ESG Program, and \$824,463 for the HOPWA Program, which together will comprise a total Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Action Plan Budget of \$3,844,889.

**SYNOPSIS & FISCAL IMP ACT:** This Ordinance enacts water, sewer, and stormwater charges and rates for Fiscal Year 2022. The charges and rates for water and sewer services will increase by three percent (3.0%). The stormwater charges and rates will increase by two percent (2.0%). This Ordinance does not amend the unit charges for sewer service contained in City Code Section 45-58.

The projected fiscal impact of this Ordinance is an annual increase of almost \$1.58 million in revenue (net of bad debt) to the Water/Sewer Fund. Below is a table showing the fiscal impact on a typical residential customer living in the City.

Finally, as a housekeeping matter, this Ordinance changes the phrase "quarterly facilities charge" to "monthly facilities charge" in Section 45-175 (d) to correct an oversight in Substitute No. 1 to Ordinance No. 17-009, which converted the frequency of the City's water/sewer/stormwater billing cycles from once a quarter to once a month.
