FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: The fiscal impact of this Ordinance is a contract for the period of three (3) years at an estimated price of Two Hundred Fifty Eight Thousand Three Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars and Thirty-Seven Cents (\$258,352.37) per year for a total estimated price of Seven Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Fifty-Seven Dollars for Eleven Cents (\$775,057.11), with the possibility of one (1) extension of three (3) years thereafter.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: This Ordinance's fiscal impact will reduce accounts receivable by forty percent (40%), from approximately \$35 million outstanding collectible to approximately \$23 million outstanding collectible.
