amends Chapter 4 (Building), Chapter 5 (Businesses) and Chapter 12 (Fire
Prevention and Protection) of the Wilmington City Code to increase certain
business license, permit, inspection, certificate, application and event fees
administered by the Department of Licenses and Inspections, the Department of
Land Use and Planning, the Fire Marshal's Office and the Department of
Finance in order to defray the cost associated with administering and enforcing
the City's laws, and the provision of certain municipal services. The Substitute
Ordinance excepts from the increased business license fee small businesses that
have been in existence less than three years, and it provides a cap to the rental
unit business license fee for businesses providing low income and senior housing.
