LEGISLATIVE BUSINESS

President Congo dispensed from calling each Councilmembers name for legislative business.

Substitute No. 1 to Ordinance No. 21-024 (Rev. 1, Agenda #0057) was **held**.

Council Member Harlee presented and called for the first and second reading Ordinance No. 22-049 (Agenda #0219) entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 37 OF THE CITY CODE TO EXTEND THE FIRE LANE ALONG THE ENTIRE EXTENSION OF CHRISTINA LANDING DRIVE

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: This Ordinance has no anticipated fiscal impact.

The above-referenced Ordinance was given two separate readings by title only and upon a motion of Council Member Harlee, seconded by Council Member McCoy, the Ordinance was received, recorded and referred to the Public Works & Transportation Committee. Motion prevailed.

Council Member Harlee presented and called for the first and second reading Ordinance No. 22-050 (Agenda #0257) entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE FOURTEEN PARCELS OF LAND WITHIN THE AREA GENERALLY BOUNDED BY MARYLAND AVENUE, THE AMTRAK RAILROAD CORRIDOR, I-95, AND LOWER ELM STREET FROM A ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF M-1 (LIGHT MANUFACTURING) TO A ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF C-2 (SECONDARY BUSINESS CENTERS)

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: This Ordinance has no anticipated negative fiscal impact.

The above-referenced Ordinance was given two separate readings by title only and upon a motion of Council Member Harlee, seconded by Council Member McCoy, the Ordinance was received, recorded and referred to the Planning Commission and Community Development and Urban Planning Committee. Motion prevailed.

Council Member Harlee presented <u>Resolution No. 22-080</u> (Agenda #0258) as follows:

WHEREAS, on December 8, 2022, an ordinance (the "Ordinance") was introduced before City Council proposing an amendment to the "Building Zone Map of Wilmington, Delaware" to change the zoning classification of fourteen parcels of land located within the area generally bounded by Maryland Avenue, the Amtrak Railroad Corridor, I-95, and Lower Elm Street (being Tax Parcel Nos. 26-042.20-015, 26-042.20-016, 26-042.20-017, 26-042.20-018, 26-042.20-019, 26-042.20-020, 26-042.20-021, 26-042.20-023, 26-042.20-024, 26-042.20-025, 26-042.20-026, 26-042.20-027, 26-042.20-095, and 26-042.20-096) from a zoning classification of M-1 (Light Manufacturing) to a zoning classification of C-2 (Secondary Business Centers); and

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission is scheduled to consider the rezoning proposed in the Ordinance at its December 13, 2022 regular meeting, after holding a duly advertised public hearing; and

WHEREAS, City Code Section 48-51 requires that a duly advertised public hearing be held by City Council prior to the adoption of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, City Council proposes to schedule a public hearing for review of the Ordinance, or a substitute thereto, to be duly advertised in conformity with City Code Section 48-51 by publication in any newspaper of general circulation, at least once, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date of the public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON that Council hereby schedules a public hearing on the Ordinance, or a substitute thereto, to be held on January 19, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers to consider the Ordinance's proposal to rezone fourteen parcels of land located within the area generally bounded by Maryland Avenue, the Amtrak Railroad Corridor, I-95, and Lower Elm Street (being Tax Parcel Nos. 26-042.20-015, 26-042.20-016, 26-042.20-017, 26-042.20-018, 26-042.20-019, 26-042.20-020, 26-042.20-021, 26-042.20-

023, 26-042.20-024, 26-042.20-025, 26-042.20-026, 26-042.20-027, 26-042.20-095, and 26-042.20-096) from a zoning classification of M-1 (Light Manufacturing) to a zoning classification of C-2 (Secondary Business Centers).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the public will be allowed to participate in the public hearing (i) in person in the City Council Chambers and (ii) virtually in accordance with 29 *Del. C.* § 10006A. The instructions for virtual participation will be provided on the agenda for the January 19, 2023 Council meeting.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of City Council and the City Clerk are hereby directed to give public notice of said hearing in the manner and form required by the provisions of the Wilmington City Charter and City Code.

Upon a motion of Council Member Harlee, seconded by Council Member McCoy, the Resolution was before the Council for its consideration. Motion prevailed. Council Member Harlee spoke on the purpose of the Resolution.

President Congo requested the Clerk call for the roll.

The above-referenced Resolution was received, adopted as read and directed to be recorded and filed by the following Yea and Nay Roll Call Vote: Yeas, Council Members Harlee, B. Fields, McCoy, Johnson, N. Field, Cabrera, Mills, Spadola and Bracy, and Council President Congo. Total, ten. Nays, none. Absent, Council Members Darby and Oliver. Total, two.

President Congo declared the Resolution adopted.

PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Council Members and Council President spoke on the following: announcements of community events throughout the various districts; the need to call for point of order during public comments; packages being stolen (porch pirates) especially during this time of the year; reminder to not leave cars running with keys in it; everyone was informed to stay tune for public safety initiatives with Collective Group; step-down of Police Chief Robert Tracy and best wishes were expressed to him and his family; Council colleagues, staff, city employees and first responders were thanked for all they do; while everyone was encouraged to support local entrepreneurs, everyone was also reminded that the holidays should not be the only time to serve the community; and including but not limited to everyone was wished a happy and safe holiday.
