BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these individuals shall contribute to the process of making findings and recommendations to City Council regarding issues of systemic racial disparity, racist practices and procedures and/or institutional discrimination against African Americans, resulting from the delivery or provision of City government services or the implementation or effect of City policies, and resulting from the delivery or provision of other government provided services or widely implemented business practices or the implementation or effect of government policies or business practices.
