AN ORDINANCE CONSTITUTING AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 OPERATING BUDGET (BEING AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SUBSTITUTE NO. 1 TO ORDINANCE NO. 23-012)

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: The fiscal impact of this Ordinance will be up to \$748,000 for Non-Union and Executive and Managerial employees, and includes related benefits costs (e.g. FICA, Medicare tax, pensions, etc.). Surplus funds already exist to implement the recommended changes.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 40 OF THE CITY CODE REGARDING BEREAVEMENT LEAVE

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: This Ordinance has no significant anticipated fiscal impact.

Council Member Darby presented and called for the first and second reading <u>Ordinance No. 23-032</u> (Agenda #0342) entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 34 OF THE CITY CODE TO MANDATE LEAD PAINT INSPECTIONS OF RESIDENTIAL DWELLINGS AND CHILDCARE FACILITIES

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: This Ordinance's fiscal impact should be *de minimis*.

The above-referenced Ordinance was given two separate readings by title only and upon a motion of Council Member Darby, seconded by Council Member McCoy, the Ordinance was received, recorded and referred to the Community Development and Urban Planning Committee. Motion prevailed.

Council Member Darby presented and called for the first and second reading <u>Ordinance No. 23-033</u> (Agenda #0343) entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 35 OF THE CITY CODE TO ENSURE EMPLOYEES IN RETAIL, HOSPITILALITY, AND FOOD SERVICES ESTABLISHMENTS ARE PROVIDED ADVANCE NOTICE OF THEIR WORK SCHEDULES; COMPENSATION FOR LATE CHANGES TO THEIR WORK SCHEDULES; RIGHT TOREST BETWEEN WORK SHIFTS; AND FIRST-RIGHT OF REFUSAL FOR ADDITIONAL WORK SHIFTS

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: Any anticipated fiscal impact is not quantifiable.

The above-referenced Ordinance was given two separate readings by title only and upon a motion of Council Member Darby, seconded by Council Member McCoy, the Ordinance was received, recorded and referred to the Community Development and Urban Planning Committee. Motion prevailed.

Council Member Darby presented and called for the first and second reading <u>Ordinance No. 23-034</u> (Agenda #0344) entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 45 OF THE CITY CODE TO EXEMPT ELDERLY AND DISABLED RESIDENTS AND RESIDENCES WITH CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF FIVE FROM WATER SERVICE DISCONNECTION FOR NONPAYMENT OF UTILITY CHARGES

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: Although this legislation exempts eligible residents from water utility shutoffs for nonpayment, the effective deployment of LIHWAP funds should offset any negative fiscal impact to the City, therefore the legislation should be revenue neutral.

The above-referenced Ordinance was given two separate readings by title only and upon a motion of Council Member Darby, seconded by Council Member McCoy, the Ordinance was received, recorded and referred to the Finance & Economic Development Committee. Motion prevailed.

PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Council Members and Council President spoke on the following: announcements of civic associations meetings and community events throughout the city; speeding cars and school being back in, everyone was encouraged to take it easy and respect the stopped buses when kids are being picked up; as some Council Members are attending the meeting in-person and some virtually, Council Members were reminded to request to be excused to ensure Council still has a quorum and not in violation; and including but not limited to, everyone was thanked for joining today's meeting and was encouraged to continue to engaged with Council.

Upon a motion of Council Member Cabrera, seconded by Council Member McCoy, Council adjourned at 7:57 p.m. Motion prevailed.
