#### **Agenda Results**

Synopsis: This Resolution is being presented by City Council for Council's review and This Resolution urges the Delaware General Assembly to enact approval. legislation that will amend City Charter § 2-204 to exclude August and December from the twice-a-month meeting requirement except when a meeting is requested by the Mayor, President of City Council, or a majority of the City Council. Like many other public institutions, the City of Wilmington is experiencing staffing shortages and ongoing financial concerns. It is the sense of this Council that the amendment to Section 2 of the City of Wilmington Home Rule Charter bolsters efficiency, productivity, accountability, and transparency in a manner that is cognizant of the present realities and resource constraints experienced by this municipality in accordance with the 2022-2025 Strategic Plan Goals of "Transparent and Well-Represented Wilmington;" "Connected, Informed and Engaged Wilmington;" and maintenance of a "Prosperous and Sustainable Wilmington."
