Wilmington's Specific Challenge:

20.2% of Wilmington, DE residents had an income below the poverty level in 2023, which was 47.8% greater than the poverty level of 10.5% across the entire state of Delaware. 13.6% of high school graduates and 34.8% of non high school graduates live in poverty.

24/7 evidence- based guidance during critical moments.

Musical activities stimulate brain development.

Six Loving Habits Curriculum

Direct implementation of Dr. Golinkoff's research framework.

Nutrition for Cognitive Development

Addresses brain- nutrition connections.

Trauma-Responsive Framework

Address effects of toxic stress.

Caregiver Leadership Pipeline

Creates sustainable community networks. Multi week parent/caregiver training programs.

Research-Based Support Frameworks



Intentional Evidence-Based Curriculum

Focused on brain development, nutrition literacy, and parent- child bonding through music and storytelling.



Multi-Week Parent Support Program

Intensive cohorts serving 100 caregivers annually, with specialized tracks for custodial and non-custodial parents.



Trauma-Responsive Community Engagement

Techniques for Trauma-Informed Parenting

Strategies to help caregivers respond to challenging behaviors stemming from traumatic experiences.

Community Healing and Identifying Generational Trauma Approaches

Recognizing and addressing trauma at community levels for collective healing and resilience-building.
