




Membership Metrics





I Am My Sister's Keeper Mentoring Program (IAMMSK)

Potter Anderson Literacy Lounge

Sponsored by Potter Anderson Law Firm and home to the Wednesday Meet and Reads, the Potter Anderson Literacy Lounge is dedicated to promoting literacy at all levels. The lounge provides a welcoming space where readers of all ages can engage with books and interactive activities. Visitors also have access to literacy-based games and learning tools on three

opening, the Nemours Hygiene Hub has distributed thousands of hygiene products to over 500 community members, thanks to generous in-kind and donations. Serving individuals primarily from the 19801 to 19805 zip codes, the Hub population in age from infants to seniors (0-90 years old). Of those served, approximately 60% are women and 40% are men.

Nemours Hygiene Hub

Established in partnership with Nemours Children's Health at the MSK Community Center, the MSK CC proudly provides essential hygiene products, free of charge, to support the well-being of our community.

MSK Dream Chasers Basketball Skills Training

Dream Chasers also offers a basketball program open to all genders and skill levels, focusing on skill

development, teamwork, and confidence both on and off

One Step at a Time After School Program

One Step at a Time is a Delaware-based nonprofit organization that provides an after-school program specifically designed to support displaced and housing-

insecure youth with tutoring and mentoring services.
One Step at a Time serves approximately 10 to 25 students, ages 6 to 12, who

are currently experiencing housing instability. The gender distribution is evenly split, with 70% girls and 30% boys.





Lewis Elementary Next Generation

I Am My Sister's Keeper ran its Next Generation Mentoring Group at Lewis Dual Language Elementary School, offering mentoring and a STEAM-based curriculum to support the personal and academic development of young girls.

In cooperation with William C. Lewis Dual Language Elementary School, I Am My Sister's Keeper successfully engaged 30 girls, ages 5 to 10, in a STEAMcentered after-school program.

Teach 21 Financial Literacy

Teach 21 Financial Literacy is a Delaware-based nonprofit organization that offers financial literacy classes to youth, equipping them with essential money management skills for lifelong success.

Teach 21 Enrichment, Inc. provided financial literacy programming to approximately 20 participants through an after-school program based at the MSK Community Center.







Urban Gardening in the Richmond-Kirkpatrick Atrium

Urban gardening plays a vital role in promoting food security, environmental sustainability, and community well-being in densely populated areas. It provides access to fresh, healthy produce in communities that may lack full-service grocery stores, often referred to as food deserts. In addition to improving nutrition, urban gardens foster community engagement, provide educational opportunities, reduce carbon footprints, and beautify neighborhoods.

A relatively new initiative, the MSK Community Center Gardens will provide fresh vegetables, lettuce, herbs to help supplement the Center's existing programs.

Flag Football

Our co-ed youth flag football program offers a fun, inclusive environment where participants of all skill levels can develop athletic abilities, learn teamwork, and build confidence through organized, non-contact play.

Approximately 25 community members participate on the MSK Community Center Flag Football Team, which competes as part of an organized league.



Meta Quest 3

Virtual Reality Hub

Participants at the MSK Community Center have the opportunity to check out a Meta Quest 3 headset and engage with virtual reality job skills programs. These immersive experiences provide hands-on training in areas such as interview preparation, workplace communication, and technical skills—bridging the digital divide and equipping community members with tools for career readiness in a modern workforce.

MSK EDGE Summer Camp

The 2025 MSK EDGE Summer Camp served 30 campers over a 7-week program, providing an engaging, educational, and nurturing environment. Campers attended from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM, with many staying for extended-day activities. The cost to families was \$75 per week, with all participants receiving breakfast, a snack, and lunch daily.

Program Highlights

- STEAM Projects: Hands-on experiments and innovation challenges encouraged problem-solving and critical thinking.
- Field Trips: Weekly excursions included local splash pads, parks, and a special trip to Killens Pond Water Park.
- Movie Fridays: Campers enjoyed themed movie experiences to end each week with fun and reflectionSports & Recreation: Organized activities
 included soccer, volleyball, pickleball, and basketball, promoting fitness and teamwork.
- Cooking with Aunt Vonda: Weekly cooking classes introduced campers to culinary basics, nutrition, and creativity in the kitchen.
- Arts & Crafts: Opportunities for self-expression through visual arts and creative projects.
- Team Building & Emotional Intelligence: Lessons and group exercises built empathy, cooperation, and self-awareness.
- Virtual Reality Experiences: Exposure to emerging technologies through interactive VR sessions.
- Christmas in July Celebration: A camp-wide festive event featuring holiday-themed games, crafts, and treats that encouraged generosity, joy, and community spirit.
- Special Feature: Aviation Week
- The camp culminated in a dynamic Aviation Week, led by Black Women in Aviation introducing campers to careers in aerospace and aviation. The week concluded with a field trip to the Wilmington Airport, offering behind-the-scenes access and real-world insights into aviation professions.

Impact

The MSK EDGE Summer Camp created a supportive space where campers gained confidence, built friendships, and explored new interests. The combination of educational enrichment, cultural celebration, and recreational fun contributed to holistic youth development—inspiring curiosity, creativity, and leadership among all participants.
