AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 34 OF THE CITY CODE TO REQUIRE LANDLORDS PROVIDE WRITTEN NOTICE OF TENANTS' RIGHTS IN LEASE

Council Member McCoy spoke to the ordinance and upon a motion from Council Member McCoy, seconded by Council Member Owens a Floor Amendment was before Council for consideration. Motion prevailed.

Council Members Owens and Darby made comments and requested to be added as co-sponsors.

Total, eleven. Absent, Council Members Johnson and Hackett. Total, two.

President Congo declared the Ordinance adopted.
