GAME PARTS

- 1 GAME BOARD
- PAIR OF DICE
- 4 PAWNS

RULES

- USING YOUR PAWN PLACE IT ON THE BLOCK WITH MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.
- TOSS THE DICE
- MOVE YOUR PAWN AS PER THE TOTAL NUMBERS ON THE DICE FACED UP. BEGIN THE GAME AT THE START LOCATION AND MOVE RIGHT TO LEFT.
- WHEN YOU LAND ON THE BLOCK YOU MUST ANSWER THE FOLLOWING 2 OUT OF 3 QUESTIONS CORRECTLY IN ORDER TO MOVE FORWARD. YOU MUST IDENTIFY THE PERSON IN THE PHOTO YOU LANDED ON, GIVE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THEIR HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE, AND GIVE THE TIME FRAME WHEN THEY ACHIEVED IT WITHIN A 50-YEAR TIME FRAME
- IF THE PERSON CANNOT ANSWER CORRECTLY THEN THEY MUST PICK A CARD FROM THE DECK.
 - IF THEY CANNOT IDENTIFY FROM ONE OF THE PHOTOS ON THE BOARD FROM THE DESCRIPTION GIVEN ON THE CARD, THEY LOSE THEIR TURN UNTIL THE NEXT ROUND.
 - THEN THEY MUST FOLLOW STEPS 2 THROUGH 5 TO CONTINUE.
- ONCE A GAME PLAYER GOES AROUND THE BOARD 1 FULL TIME THEY MUST TURN AROUND ON THE BOARD AND CONTINUE TO PLAY UNTIL THEY REACH BACK AT THE START BLOCK.
- THE GAME IS OVER ONCE THE 1ST GAME PLAYER REACHES THE START BLOCK.
- THE PATH TO FREEDOM BLOCK
 - WHEN LANDING ON THE BLOCK “PATH TO FREEDOM“ ONE MUST PICK A CARD AND IDENTIFY THE ANSWER WITH THE PHOTO ON THE BOARD.

- This information also gives each of the Champions of Freedom persons number position on the board, but this number will not be listed on the cards. Only the description of the person will be listed on the cards.
 - This information sheet should not be visible to the players of the game.
1. **Martin Luther King Jr.**
Civile rights activist of the 1950's and 1960's. Well, known for the “I have a Dream”, speech.
 2. **Thurgood Marshall**
1st Black man to become part of the Supreme Court.
 3. **Benjamin Banneker**
He helped design the city of Washington, DC from 1781 to 1806. Free Black American, astronomer, mathematician, and inventor. He made the 1st all wood clock.
 4. **Nat Turner**
Led one of the most massive slave revolts.
 5. **Barack Obama**
1st Black President of the United States of America”. 44th president of the USA and great orator.
 6. **John Brown**
A White abolitionist who died fighting for the freedom of Blacks.
 7. **Frederick Douglass**
Black abolitionist and author who developed the North Star newspaper.
 8. **Malcolm X**
Revolutionary Muslim minister and civil rights leader.
 9. **Harriet Tubman**
Black abolitionist and social activist who was an escaped slave. She conducted 13 missions to rescue 70 enslaved black people through safe houses known as the Underground Railroad.
 10. **Carter G. Woodson**
Historian and author known as the Father of Black History. Founder of Black History Month.
 11. **Maya Angelou**
Black author, poet, performer and civil rights activist.
 12. **Henry Highland Garnet**
Black abolitionist, minister, educator, orator and diplomat..

13. Martin Delany

Black abolitionist, journalist, physician, military officer and writer.

14. Fred Hampton

Activist, revolutionary socialist, part of the Black Panthers. Co founder of the Rainbow Coalition.

15. James Baldwin

Writer, and Civil Rights activist known for novels, essays and plays.

16. Langston Hughes

Central figure of the Harlem Renaissance known for his poetry.

17. Rosa Parks

Civil rights activist best known for refusing to move from her seat on the bus in Alabama in defiance of Jim Crow laws.

18. Huey P. Newton

Revolutionary and political activist and the cofounder of the Black Panther Party.

19. Path to Freedom –

NOT A CARD BUT IT'S THE 19th PLACE ON THE BOARD. Players pick a card if they land on this block.

20. Ralph Bunche

The 1st Black man to receive the Nobel Peace Prize.

21. Muhammad Ali

Heavyweight boxing champion of the world. Social activist, one of the greatest athletes of the 20th century.

22. Jesse Jackson

Civil Rights Activist, minister. Founder of, “The Rainbow Coalition.”

23. Louis Farrakhan

Religious leader and minister who heads the Nation of Islam. Spearheaded the Million Man March.

24. Tommy Smith & John Carlos

Track and Field Olympic Champions who gained international fame when they gave the Black Power salute at the 1968 Olympics after winning the gold and silver, respectively.

25. Lewis Howard Latimer

Inventor of the evaporative air conditioner, improved the lightbulb and the toilet, system for railroad cars.

26. Kentanji Brown Jackson

Lawyer and jurist who is the 1st Black woman to serve on the Supreme Court.

27. Marcus Garve

Jamaican political activist and founder of the Universal Negro Improvement Association. Known for , “The Back to Africa Movement.”

28. Ida B. Wells

Investigative journalist, socialist, educator, early leader of the Civil Rights movement. Cofounder of the NAACP.

29. Eldridge Cleaver

Writer activist. Early leader of the Black Panthers.

30. Madame C. J. Walker

Entrepreneur, social activist, 1st female to become a self-made millionaire in America.

31. Medgar Evers

Civil Rights activist and soldier. NAACP’s 1st field secretary in Mississippi. Assassinated in 1963.

32. Paul Robeson

Singer, actor, athlete, activist and famous for cultural accomplishments and a political stance.

33. Angela Davis

Marxist and feminist political activist, philosopher, author and professor.

34. Booker T. Washington

Educator, author and leader from 1890 – 1915 of the Black community and contemporary Black elite.

35. W. E. B. Du Bois

Socialist, writer historian and African Civil Rights activist.

36. Sojourner Truth

Abolitionist and Civil Rights activist. Born into slavery and became the 1st Black woman to win a case against a white man.

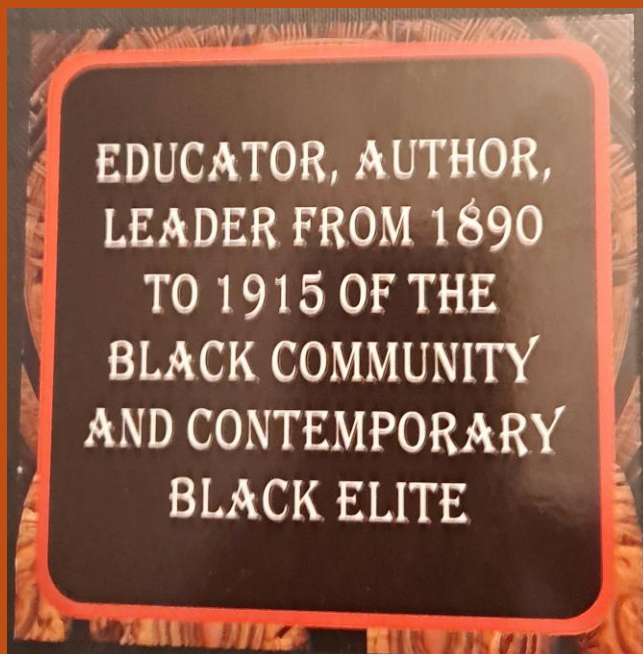
